

The things you can do with an iPhone are . . .

An adviser who owns an iPhone contacted me and asked, "Have you seen the WordFoto app for the iPhone? Do you think we could use the pictures it produces in the yearbooks?" Well, that was the first I had heard of that app. However, once I saw it, I loved it and truly hoped it would work in yearbooks. I hoped the quality would be good because the app has some wonderful possibilities for dividers, theme pages, endsheets and maybe even covers.

What does it do? It does this→



I started with a photo I was sent by the school. They took it with a digital SLR. From the e-mail they attached it to, I saved the photo to my Photos app on my iPhone. Then I opened up WordFoto. In the app, you can either take

a photo or import one from your photo library library. I imported the photo from my library.

Once I had the photo imported, I added my own words (in this case, just three—weight, muscle and train). I clicked "Back" and this is what I got. It couldn't be simpler. And as you can see, it enlarges beautifully.

You can also tweak the settings if you want. There are eight regular settings (black and white, sepia, etc.), and you can create your own custom settings. (See the screen shots.)

You can read so much more about this app at www.word-foto.com. Here's my favorite part. The app is only \$1.99 in the iTunes App store. If you are interested in something like this, that price is amazing for this software.

And while there is currently no way to move the words exactly where you want them, you can change words, mix up their order and do some other things to make them work the way you want them.

FotoWord is available for the iPhone 3GS, 4, 4S, 3rd and 4th Generation iPod Touch and both versions of iPad. Of course, since some of those devices don't have their own cameras, you will have to import the photo as I did.
